Fruits of the Holy Spirit

We were fortunate enough to have a couple of days on the Isle of Wight, where we could enjoy some valuable downtime and have a chance to re-visit some favourite haunts. One such place was a visit to Bembridge and we spent some time looking across the Solent and visiting the RNLI shop located by Bembridge Life Station, we are sure many of you will also have visited here. Our thoughts soon turned to the wonderful work of the RNLI and what it takes to be a member of a potentially life-saving team.

Coincidently, looking at the lectionary Reading for this week, "but the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control" (Galatians 5:22-23), has made us reflect on what it means to live out these "fruits" and how the actions of life-boat teams here and across the world, reflect many, if not all, of these qualities.

Love: Unselfish concern for others, putting their needs before your own.

Joy: A deep-seated sense of well-being and gladness, not based on circumstances, but on one's relationship with God.

Peace: Inner tranquillity and calm, even amidst chaos and stress.

Patience: The ability to endure difficult situations and people with grace and understanding.

Kindness: Being considerate, compassionate, and helpful to others.

Goodness: Moral excellence and righteousness in actions and character.

Faithfulness: Trustworthiness, loyalty, and dependability.

Gentleness: Being mild-mannered, considerate, and tender in interactions with others.

Self-control: Exercising discipline over one's thoughts, actions, and desires. (Al Generated)

These are virtues that grow within us, when our lives are rooted in God and nourished by faith. How can we see the fruits of the spirit in our everyday lives?

Love is undoubtedly the cornerstone of our human existence (1 Corinthians 13 v 13), "three things that remain – faith, hope and love – and the greatest of these is love" and however hard love can be to find at times, simply engaging in acts of genuine care can nurture this particular fruit of the Spirit. Joy is more than happiness, happiness may only occur in fleeting moments, but real joy comes from within and just doing things shared with friends and loved ones, go along way in this sense of joy. In this world of troubled times, we may feel that peace is an unattainable ideal and striving for peace in our own lives can be difficult but turning to God in prayer and asking for His help, may help us to find the peace we cannot find alone. Billy Graham, was quoted as saying "I don't have any more patience than anyone else; I just use mine." Patience is a gift, but we have to choose to use the gift to make it meaningful. The virtue of kindness means being part of the solution, not part of the problem. How many times have we been told "if you can't say anything nice, then say nothing"? We should strive to utter words that uplift in all that we do. Goodness can be translated as generosity, with our time, emotions, our money and our spirit. A helpful question maybe "can I give a little more?" Faithfulness is synonymous with trusting and believing always that whatever ever happens in this roller-coaster of a life, we will be okay, because we do not journey alone. Gentleness goes along way in making people feel they are cared for, using a lighter touch in our dealings with people can mean so much. Self-control is arguably the hardest fruit of the Spirit to achieve (how many times have we had to follow a tractor when we are running late!), it takes grace and plenty of practice!

May the fruits of the Holy Spirit bloom within our lives, just as it does for members of the RNLI!

Planning an eco-holiday is a great way to travel responsibly while minimising your environmental impact. Here are some key tips from the Methodist Website:

Choose eco-friendly accommodations — Look for hotels, lodges, or homestays that are certified for sustainability, use renewable energy, and promote responsible tourism.

Opt for greener transportation — Reduce your carbon footprint by travelling via train,

bus, or carpooling instead of flying. If flying is necessary, consider direct flights to minimise emissions. **Pack sustainably** – Bring reusable water bottles, eco-friendly toiletries and cloth bags instead of plastic.

Avoid single-use items whenever possible.

Support local and ethical businesses – Choose locally sourced food, sustainable souvenirs, and tour operators that prioritise conservation and fair wages.

Respect nature and wildlife – Stick to marked trails, avoid disturbing local wildlife, and never purchase products made from endangered species.

Leave no trace – Dispose of waste responsibly, recycle when possible, and aim to leave places cleaner than you found them.







Worship Leading Course

It is intended to run this course of five sessions in the autumn of 2025 in the Winchester, Eastleigh and Romsey Circuit, offered also to the surrounding Circuits. The course will be held fortnightly so that members will have time to reflect on the material between sessions.

This course is for people who feel a call to lead aspects of worship. It will be necessary for those wishing to be recognised as Worship Leaders in their church to attend all the sessions.

It may also be a refresher for those already recognised as worship leaders or indeed local preachers as part of ongoing learning and development.

You will also be very welcome to join if you are just interested in the subject!

The sessions will be held at:

The sessions will last 90 mins each and be led by Revd Dr Howard Mellor with involvement from Circuit Ministers, and experienced Local Preachers and Worship Leaders. There is also an option for those wishing to be acknowledged as Worship Leaders to attend the Local Preachers and Worship Leaders Meeting on 18 November.

The course will be interactive with input, sharing, working on topics and Q&A. Outline notes will be available at the end of each session. The sessions are fortnightly to allow time for reflection and preparation.

Those who participate fully in the course will receive a certificate. For those who wish to be recognised as Worship leaders (though there is no obligation), notification will be given to their Minister and Church Council. Experienced Worship leaders will be encouraged to support and encourage those beginning this journey of service.

Course Outline:

Exploring Worship: examining the nature and scope of worship. Why it is important. Looking at its biblical roots. Considering the structure of worship as it has developed. The role of Worship Leaders in the Methodist Church.

Shaping Worship: working together to consider the constituent parts of worship and the way we can shape them for worship appropriate to a specific congregation. We will explore the use of music, the treasury of hymns and songs, prayer, silence, movement, ritual, drama and art.

Effective Worship Leading: considering our skills such as preparation, stance, voice projection and ways of developing and using notes. A chance to read a prepared passage to the group. Enabling others to join in leading worship with us.

Creative ideas for Prayer: looking at the various elements of prayer and exploring creative ways of weaving them into worship. Examining resources for prayer with encouragement to write our own.

Ideas for Advent Worship: a practical session using the learning from the earlier sessions. Each course member to research, bring and share ideas for worship during Advent which could be offered for use in services with the appointed preacher.


